

## CHAPTER 23 – STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS

### Sec. 23-11. Street naming; street name changes.

A developer/subdivider may propose the street names (i.e., identification/designation) subject to the final approval by the City Council. The street names on plats are tentative and the Engineering Department shall assign the final street names as part of the final plat or right of way deed approval process. The final street name approval shall be authorized by the City Council via resolution, plat or right of way approval.

The City shall set up Administrative Procedures for establishing and changing street names. The Administrative Procedure shall establish rules and guidelines for the City to implement with respect to establishing and changing street names. Additionally, such Administrative Procedures shall be updated when, in the opinion of the City Engineer, the conditions of the current procedures have changed so as to necessitate such update. Requests for street naming or changing a street name shall comply with the City's Administrative Procedures. The Administrative Procedures shall be available at the City Clerk's office and the City Engineering Department during normal business hours.

Street names will be consistent with the natural alignment and extension of existing streets, the Maricopa Association of Governments Address and Street Alignment Policy, and other constraints and considerations the City deems necessary. New Street names shall not duplicate in whole or in part, or be confusing with existing street names. The Engineering Department reserves the right to modify street names to conform to City standards.

Changes to street names (i.e., renaming streets) on an approved and recorded plat shall require a re-plat.

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
